

## Task 2 instructions

You will need two different coloured pens to complete this exercise.

**For this exercise, assume you are a typical, mid-income member of a community.** You live about half a mile from the coast, about 10m above sea level.

- In an **HIC**, you would own a house, have a car and savings, and are literate with good access to the internet.
- In an **LIC**, you will have a smaller, lower quality, smaller house, possibly access to a car (though you may not own it), you are literate, but have sporadic and/or slow internet connectivity.

Considering how your own personal circumstances give you the ability to mitigate (reduce) or avoid the impacts of tropical cyclone, complete the worksheet.

Remember to consider that personal cost might be lower in monetary terms in an LIC country, but probably higher in absolute terms as that person probably doesn't have savings or the ability to borrow money to recover from the impacts.
